
Introduction

Welcome to the 100 Dreams Classroom Project! Our goal for this guide is to give you everything you need for a class project that will help your students:

- envision how the world can change in the future
- communicate what they hope to accomplish as adults
- gain understanding of other children throughout the world.

The drawing and writing assignment (see below) is the centerpiece of the project. We also highly recommend you begin by showing your students the 17-minute documentary film "One Day." It engagingly tells the story of how six 10-year-olds in different countries dream about the future.

The Drawing & Writing Assignment

Ask your students to each create one or two drawings, using any type or size of paper. Provide whatever media is most comfortable for them and easily available: pencils, paints, crayons, oil pastels, markers, etc.


Drawing 1

Imagine what your city or town will be like when you are an adult. Think about what you will have that we don't have now and how things will be different. You can invent anything you want. Draw what that looks like, and then write a paragraph describing your vision.

Drawing 2

Think about what you will be doing as an adult and how you will make your mark on the world. What will the space look like where you will be doing this? What things will be around you in that space? You can invent anything you want. Draw what that looks like, and then write a paragraph describing your vision.

After the drawings and descriptions are done, spend time with your class showing and talking about your students' dreams and/or those created by children around the world that are on the 100.steelcase.com/100-dreams page of our anniversary website. Talk about the similarities and differences among the fellow dreamers and what it might take to make the dreams come true.

Share the Dreams (optional)

We've identified three different ways for you to share your students' dreams beyond your own classroom.

Option 1: Share your students' dreams at your school.


Have the children complete the assignment and post their dreams in your school gymnasium, cafeteria or hallways. Invite family, neighbors and friends to visit your school to view the drawings and stories.

Option 2: Share your students' dreams on a Facebook page.

Give your students' dreams more exposure by posting their work on Facebook. (Make sure you get any necessary approval and releases from parents.) Create a new Facebook page or use an existing school Facebook page. Scan and upload the drawings to a photo album. Also consider uploading your students' work on the Steelcase Facebook page. That way your school will be added to an online world map showing dreamers' locations.

Option 3: Conduct a contest and submit the winning dream to Steelcase.

Create a pool of participants (your classroom, grade, school or district) and have them complete the assignment. Select a winner and send the drawing, written description, photo of the artist and a completed release form (attached) to Steelcase. The young dreamer will be added to the 100.steelcase.com/100-dreams page of the site and featured on the 100.steelcase.com/100-years blog section of our anniversary website.

- 4 Send all the files (10MB or smaller) via email to: 100anniversary@steelcase.com
- 5 Watch for it to appear on the 100.steelcase.com/100-dreams page and be featured on the 100.steelcase.com/100-years blog section of our anniversary website within 30 days.
